





Type:

- Traditional
- Online

General Docs required:

- Address proof = rental contract
- ID = Passport & VISA
- Student A/c = Certificat de Scolarité (final inscription) [with Numero d'etudiant(e)]

Note:

- Always do the payments and transactions inside France, with your French bank account.
- Latest 3 months' FRENCH BANK STATEMENT is MANDATORY for VISA RENEWAL.
- Do not use forex cards after the initial few weeks in France.

CAF

APL - Aid by the french government for accommodation

- Make simulation on CAF website https://www.caf.fr/allocataires/mes-services-en-ligne/faire-une-simulation
- Approx 30% 40% of your rent, upto a max of around Eur 250.
 Eg. Rent: Eur 360, APL obtained = Eur 160
- Colocation (house sharing) : less proportion of CAF.
- Apply as soon as you move-in.
- Delay of 2-3 months for first payment (*Usually APL is allocated from the 2nd month) Eg. Move in 15th Sept 2021, APL rights: 1st Oct, 1st Payment : Dec or Jan 2021
- People on APS (job search visa) get more aid.

Part-time jobs and Tax https://www.impots.gouv.fr/

- Tax declaration for students is important too. It is helpful while,
 - Looking for an accommodation
 - Proving the residency in France while applying to resident card, french citizenship, etc.
- It is mandatory (1AJ),
 - If you earned more than 18255€ via part-time jobs, internships, apprenticeship, etc.
- Three main taxes are likely to concern you:
 - Income tax (even if the income is 0€)
 - Housing tax (applicable if you are not staying at a student residence like CROUS, etc)
 - Contribution to public broadcasting "audiovisuel public" (if you have a television)



Right of residence in France for foreign students



What is the Digital Administration for Foreigners (ANEF) in France?

A single portal, where the user has a personal account where he can follow, in real time, the progress of his file:


- Validation of a long-stay visa as a residence permit (VLS-TS)
- First applications or renewals of residence permits (student, talent passport, visitor, duplicate)
- Application for a work permit
- Declaration of change of situation (address)

An approach in 6 steps





Step 1: Personal information

Step 2: Reason for stay: Student

Step 3: Resources
▶ bank certificate of sufficient credit balance, i.e. <u>any</u> bank document <u>in</u>
<u>French</u>, allowing you to establish that you have at least 615€ per month.
▶ Salary slips, scholarships, sponsorship, bank statements....



Step 4: Proof of your student status

You must prove that you are <u>progressing</u> in your studies <u>within a coherent</u> <u>curriculum</u> (beware of changes in curriculum).

\blacktriangleright For the past year (n-1):

- academic records
- or certificate of achievement issued by your institution
- or certificate of validation of each semester
- or certificate of promotion to the next year
- or diploma obtained



Step 4: Proof of your student status

For the current year :

- final registration
- or school certificate

mentioning the year of the course followed (e.g.: L2 or 2nd year of business school) and if possible for higher education schools (business/engineering...) the duration of the course in order to be able to claim a multi-annual residence permit.



Step 5: Summary: Check the summary of your application and documents

Step 6: Confirmation: Your application is confirmed



You will receive a certificate of deposit ("attestation de dépôt).



CERTIFICATES

-Certificate of filing (Attestation de dépôt): automatically generated when the application is registered / no fee

 Certificate of a favourable decision (Attestation de décision favorable): issued after the application has been processed and pending the issue of a residence permit.

- ➢Gives the right to stay in France
- >Mentions the period of validity of the permit being prepared,

 \geq Allows you to <u>travel</u> within the Schengen area, to return to France after a trip to a country outside the EU, to <u>work</u> as a secondary occupation...

- Certificate of extension (Attestation de prolongation): if issued
- Gives the right to stay in France




When to submit my application

Earlier: submission during the 2 months before the expiry of the permit Avant : dépôt dans les 2 mois précédant l'expiration du titre

What to do when ANEF is blocked

- 2) Keep a screen shot of the entry
- 3) Keep a screen shot of the answer
- 4) Request an **appointment**, via the **website** of the **Prefecture of** Police, **contact form** (select "Centre de réception des étudiants et chercheurs internationaux en service" = Reception Centre for international students and researchers on duty)

Subject: Request for an appointment following the blocking of ANEF +

copy of the screenshots



Should hold :

✓ a diploma (or certificate of achievement issued after deliberation by the jury) at least equivalent to <u>Master's</u> level (<u>Bac+5</u>),

or

✓ a diploma (or certificate of achievement issued after deliberation by the jury) of a professional licence,

or

✓ a Specialized <u>Master's degree</u> or a Master of Science degree from a member of the <u>Conférence des grandes écoles</u> (CGE).



Issued in the year of graduation

Valid for 12 months, renewable once, the APS allows :

 \succ to look for a job or to create a business related to one's studies or research.

≻to work up to 60% of full time, i.e. 964 hours in a year




15 days after <u>signing</u> a <u>work contract related to</u> the diploma obtained and paid 1.5 times the SMIC (minimum wage).

>I request my change of status (required)

I can work at 100% while waiting for a decision on my application as long as my APS is valid and as long as I am sure that my contract corresponds to my diploma and that it pays me more than 1.5 times the SMIC.



15 days after <u>signing</u> a <u>work contract related to</u> the diploma obtained and paid 1.5 times the minimum wage.



Employee or temporary worker: online application for <u>a</u> work permit on ANEF, then once <u>obtained</u>, <u>application for an</u> <u>appointment at the prefecture to obtain the residence permit</u>



Student discounts and tips - Part 1



Paris - Carte Imagine R http://www.imagine-r.com/

- If you are under 26 and a student, you can get the Carte Imagine R card, valid for one year, for travel in the entire Paris Region (Île-de-France).
- The Imagine R annual card costs €350, payable once or over 9 instalments, without any additional fees, +€8 administration fee. To subscribe, pick up an application from a RATP station or apply online.

- Youth card for young people age 12-27, at the price of €49 which, subject to certain conditions, offers discounts on TGV, TER and Intercité trains:
 - 30% guaranteed discount on all TGV and Intercité trains, with compulsory booking
 - o 30% off on trains to Germany, Italy, Switzerland and Luxembourg
 - 25% to 50% discount on TER and Intercité trains without compulsory booking
 - 15% off on AVIS car rentals and other Last-minute offers

• If you are between 16 and 27 years of age and you travel at least twice a month on TGV and Intercité trains, this offer is worthwhile. For €79 a month, with TGVMAX, you can travel as often as you like.

Communication - Sim cards and internet

- Necessity of Indian SIM card for OTP purposes
- Recharge Indian number with annual validity plan or monthly validity plans to keep it active
- In France, there are multiple service providers, namely
 - Free Mobile
 - Bouygues
 - SFR & RED
 - Orange etc.
- General monthly cost = approx 10 euros for internet and calls
- You can easily port your number to another operator, when you find a better plan.

Housing and Personal Safety in France



Obtaining housing

Not easy, but France has a number of laws to protect tenants

- If something looks too good to be true, it probably isn't true (housing, jobs, people...)!
- Verify that the accommodation exists, is safe (locks) and clean
- Get a rental agreement, contract or attestation d'hébergement read before signing!
- Verify what is covered by your rental agreement: utilities, safety deposits, notice periods...
- If you don't have a sponsor/guarantor and can't get decent/legal housing: Visale.fr
- All public universities and some private ones: **CROUS or student office** for financial, social, housing problems

- If your university/school makes false promises of housing report them to the Embassy!





Housing and Personal Safety in France



Staying safe

No place is 100% safe, but don't be an easy victim

- Trust your instincts!
- Be aware of where you are and what's around you: keep doors locked, follow rules, don't walk in isolated areas
- If you feel threatened or are a victim, get help from the police, your university... (see list)

Emergency Services: 15

- Keep a list of **emergency numbers** on your phone and in your wallet/purse
- Keep a card with emergency contacts who should be informed if you are sick or in trouble
- Legal help: covered by many insurance contracts or banks, otherwise ask your town hall
- Medical care and mental health care: cannot be refused if you need them, even if you cannot pay

Don't wait until you are past helping!

Medical Insurance



- Office Français de l'Imigration et de l'Intégration
- Obtain the OFII stamp

Finding a doctor

- Find a local doctor (médecin généraliste).
- Or, find a doctor online on DOCTOLIB
- Obtain a paper from the doctor agreeing to be your 'médecin généraliste'

Social Security & Insurance

- Go to your local CPAM (Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie) or your local CAF (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales) with ID & visa.
- Student Medical Insurance can be obtained during university admissions.
- Obtain your 'Carte Vitale'





Mental Health



- <u>B</u>ureau d'<u>A</u>ide <u>P</u>sychologique <u>U</u>niversitaire
- Free for any university students
- Must have social security and medical insurance
- Unlimited sessions as long as you need.
- May redirect towards other institutions depending on language barrier
- May have a long waiting period

CMP

- <u>Centre Médico-P</u>sychologique
- Free (social security & medical insurance)
- May have a long waiting period depending on the institution.
- They can obtain translators if needed or redirect towards institution with Indian psychologists if needed.

Liberal psychologist or psychiatrist

- Can be found on DOCTOLIB or on the internet.
- Can get an appointment almost immediately depending on the urgency of your situation.
- Not free (can cost between 20-60 euros for a student depending on the psychologist)
- Regular longer weekly session
